Re: <u>HB 3507</u> – Increase eligibility of down payment assistance programs administered by

Oregon Housing and Community Services – Support

The League of Women Voters of Oregon believes that the federal government shares with other levels of government the responsibility to provide equality of opportunity for education, employment, and housing for all persons in the United States regardless of their race, color, gender, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation or disability.

HB 3507 proposes to invest \$30 million in down payment assistance to Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS) to increase the eligibility of its Culturally Responsive Organization Program and Homeownership Program targeted to low- and moderate-income first-time homebuyers. Historically, these households have yet to experience the financial benefits of homeownership. Prospective homebuyers in rural Oregon can benefit greatly from access to down payment assistance.

The bill will amend OHCS's down payment assistance programs to increase eligibility by January 1, 2026. This bill is critical to building assets and creating generational wealth for low-and moderate-income households.

Investing \$30 million will open the door to an estimated 750 first-time and first-generation homebuyers, helping them plant roots in their communities.

We recommend passage of <u>HB 3507</u> and appreciate the opportunity to comment on this bill. Thank you for your service.
